



The Project “Democratization of Dniester River Basin Governance” (2008-2011) is supported by Dutch Ministry of Foreign Affairs, is realising by Eco-TIRAS in partnership with WECF - Women of Europe for Common Future, and has a goal to improve the management of 4 Dniester tributaries (Bucovat, Moldova, NGO-coordinators “XXI Century”; “Terra-1530”).

Activities:

- A multi stakeholder process led to the implementation of 4 demonstration projects in 4 localities along the Bucovati tributary: Dolna, Micleuseni, Lozova and Vorniceni, in close cooperation with the local population, local authorities and youth.
- 16,000 seedlings have been planted along **32 km** of the Bucovat stream by over 100 volunteers.
- The Strategy for sustainable development of the Bucovat Stream for 2010-2020 has been approved by the local authorities.
- Exchange of experience with project partners from Berejani, Ukraine took place.
